Making Fabric Labels for Doll Clothes

You need Freezer Paper, cut a piece 8 ½" by 11", a piece of cotton fabric that is smooth without texture, cut to the same size. Scotch tape, a computer program to make labels, and a spray sealant. I use clear coat Spray Krylon varnish.

Iron the piece of freezer paper to the piece of fabric, shiny side to the fabric. Tape across the top edge to keep from separating in the printer. Insert into the printer so that the fabric will be printed on.

Go into your Label maker program and make a label any size you would like, I used the 30-label sheet size and 3 rows of 10. Can be done smaller or larger, depending on your needs. Then when finished hit print. Important; LET INK DRY or it will smudge. Iron again to heat set the ink and then spray two light coats of sealant on the labels. Remove the freezer paper backing and cut apart.
